

LIKE RECEIVES LAW DEGREE

EDINBURGH, Oct. 4--General Dwight D. Eisenhower, US Army Chief of Staff, received an honorary degree of Doctor of Laws from Edinburgh University yesterday. Thousands of persons stood in the main to cheer the victorious Allied military leader as he went about the city.

America's top soldier is currently on a tour of US installations in Europe, his first since becoming Chief of Staff. He has conferred with his two top military leaders, theater commander General Joseph T. McNarney, and Deputy military Governor Lt. Gen. Lucius Clay.

General Eisenhower's itinerary in Scotland includes a brief vacation on the famous Scottish golf links.
